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What is this product?

Type	The PRIIP is a non-cellular company limited by shares with an unlimited life, incorporated under the Companies (Guernsey) Law, 2008 and is listed on the London Stock Exchange Main Market. As such, there is no maturity date. Shares of the PRIIP are bought and sold via markets. Typically, at any given time on any given day, the price you pay for a share will be higher than the price at which you could sell it and brokers may additionally charge commissions. The product has borrowed to purchase assets. This will magnify any gains or losses made by the company.
Objectives	The PRIIP's investment objectives is to provide its shareholders with regular dividends and an attractive total return while limiting downside risk, through the origination, execution, acquisition and servicing of a diversified portfolio of real estate debt investments (including debt instruments) in the UK and the wider European Union's internal market. In addition, the PRIIP has a specific Dividend policy, which states it continues to target an annualised dividend of 5.5 pence per Ordinary Share.
Intended retail investor	The PRIIP will primarily be marketed to institutional and sophisticated investors, investment professionals, high net worth bodies corporate, unincorporated associations, partnerships and trustees of high trusts and private clients (all of whom will invest through brokers).

How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?

The minimum recommended holding period for the product is 3 years, however, the shares of the PRIIP trade continuously on the London Stock Exchange Main Market and is not bound by any prescribed redemption or sale restrictions.

Information on the gearing and borrowing limit can be found on page 48 of the prospectus dated 2015. However, at the Annual General Meeting held on 06 May 2016, the borrowing limit was increased to 30% of NAV at time of drawdown, of which 20% may be longer term. Depending on how you buy these shares you may incur other costs, including broker commission, platform fees and Stamp Duty. The distributor will provide you with additional documents where necessary.

Discount-triggered realisation

The Company has in place a discount-triggered realisation mechanism whereby if the Ordinary Shares trade at an average discount to Net Asset Value per Share of five per cent or more during the six month period ending 31 December 2022 (and in the six month period ending on the successive fifth anniversary of such date) the Directors, at their absolute discretion, may put forward a realisation offer to Shareholders (subject to applicable law, including the requirements of the Companies (Guernsey) Law, 2008) (a "Realisation Offer").

Realisation vote

In the event that the conditions for a Realisation Offer (as described under "Discount-Triggered Realisation") are not satisfied and such offer is not activated, the Directors shall exercise the discretion afforded to them under the Articles to put forward a realisation vote.

The Board is actively investigating and considering the options available to them in the best interests of Shareholders. This process is ongoing and the outcome uncertain at the current time.
